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HISTORIC SITES

Greene County

Greene County was formed from Orange County in 1838 and named for Nathanael Greene, a Major-General in the Revolutionary War who stood second only to General Washington. The

land for the court house, clerk's office, and jail was donated by Captain
William Stanard, the founder of the town, which became the county seat
and was called Stanardsville. The symbol of Greene County comes from
a legendary trip made by Lieutenant Governor Spotswood of the
Virginia Colony, passing through what is now Greene County in 1716.
The Greene County Historical Society's A Greene County History
chronicles the legend: "We are told that [at the end of the journey,
Spotswood] gave each of [his men] a golden horseshoe in which colored
stones represented the nails. On one side was the Latin motto, 'Sic juvat

transcendere montes' (How delightful it is to cross mountains). On the other side were the words, 'The Tramontane Order.' Unfortunately the golden horseshoes, if Spotswood did actually present them to the men, have all been lost."

The Bickers-Whitlock House

This handsome terracotta-roofed house and out-buildings on the eastern side of Noon Whistle Pottery (built 1930 as Stanardsville Motor Company) was built in 1906 by I.V. Bickers, who was prominent in bringing services such as gas and water to the town of Stanardsville.

Gibson Chapel and Martha Bagby Battle House

(National Historic Sites)

Located at the Blue Ridge School in Dyke, the Chapel's design was donated in 1924 by Ralph Adams Cram, the nation's foremost practitioner of the Gothic style. Cram was best know for such monumental works as the West Point and Princeton University chapels. The spare but deft work, executed in native fieldstone was carried to completion in 1932 by local workmen and students under the supervision of



Charlottesville architect Stanislaw Makielski. Makielski also designed the adjacent Tudor-style Martha Bagby Battle House, built in 1934 as the headmaster's residence.

Grace Episcopal Church



The Carpenter Gothic structure facing Spotswood Trail at the center of Stanardsville was constructed in 1901. The parish was founded by the Bishop of Virginia as a missionary outpost to the mountain people. Part of a national social and religious movement historians call the Third Great Awakening, the Episcopal missionaries focused on literacy, health care, and religious worship. In 1926, at the height of the missionary movement, there were six Episcopal places of worship in Greene County, several school houses, and two health care clinics.

Greene County Courthouse (National Historic Site)

The Courthouse is situated centrally, opposite Stanardsville Methodist Church, and still houses Greene County's trials and other court cases. According to the Virginia Landmarks Register, the Courthouse is a polished representative of an important group of Roman Revival courthouses scattered through Virginia's Piedmont region. It was erected in 1838 and follows the standard temple-form format with a properly executed Doric entablature. The Courthouse was heavily damaged by fire in 1979, but the exterior survived intact. The interior has since been restored.



Old Greene County Jailhouse



Built in 1838, the jail is located on Court Square in the center of Stanardsville, next to the Courthouse. In "Four Years with the Stone-Wall Brigade," John Casler writes about one of the more famous escapes from its confines. It is now the home of the Greene County Historical Society Museum.



Are you a history buff? Then be sure to visit Greene County Historical Society and Museum in the old jailhouse. The Society collects and displays artifacts illustrating the **8,000 years of pre-history and history of the County**. It is also home to a **110,000-name genealogy database** of names of descendants of Greene County residents. The Museum and Genealogy Research Center are open on Fridays and Saturdays, from 10 till 3, and by appointment. Phone 434-985-1409 or see www.GreeneHistory.org for more information.

Lafayette Inn

Built in 1840, this elegant inn and restaurant has also been used as a bar, a lawyer's office, and even a buggy and harness shop in later years. The Lafayette even housed Greene County's first telephone exchange. The inn now owns the former Dicey's Cottage, which is said to have been built as slave quarters for the inn, as well as the Eddins-Davis House across the street which was built in 1900 and was once a boarding house for teachers.



Rosa Taylor House

John Sorrille, who was believed to have been a book-keeper for President Madison at Montpelier, built this house in 1815 to use the front room as his store. The house was possibly once used as a tollhouse for the turnpike over the mountains and sits on the western side of what is now Noon Whistle Pottery.

Shiloh Baptist Church

The original church is located at the end of Shiloh rd. and was built in 1862, and the present structure dates from 1907. Behind the church are two other buildings, the smaller of which was formerly a segregated African-American high school (6th-8th grades). The larger building was an elementary school also known as the Odd Fellow Building. Between these markers, enclosed by a fence and decorated by four boxwoods is a simple marker: "Unknown dead of Ewell's Army." Richard S. Ewell (1817-1872) was a Confederate general renowned for his irreverent language and appearance.

Stanardsville Methodist Church

This church, just across from the Courthouse, was built in 1858 and played an important role common to the Civil War. Townspeople nursed soldiers from both sides who were brought to the church during the Battle of Stanardsville. The gallery, which still exists, was once used by slaves who drove their masters to church.



BIKING

This trail takes you through Stanardsville, the seat of Greene County, to visit wonderfully historic buildings and some of the finest antique stores and artisan studios in the County.



South River Loop (8.2 miles, Easy to Moderate)

This is one of the most scenic rides in Greene County, providing sweeping pasture and mountain views and a look at one of the best trout waterways in the County, South River.

Bacon Hollow Trail (12.4 miles, Hard to Extreme)

This bike trail can be one of the toughest challenges in the County. However, the trail also features two of the most picturesque Appalachian sites anywhere: the Blue Ridge School, which is home to two beautiful stone-built National Historic Sites, Gibson Chapel and Martha Bagby Battle House (see p. 3) and Stone Mountain Vineyards (see p. 7).

FISHING

The **Rapidan Wildlife Management Area** contains portions of **the Conway River** and its major tributary, **Devils Ditch**. The stream contains brook trout in the upper reaches with wild brown trout scattered through the lower portions. Access to the Conway River is north of Stanardsville and can be reached by Route 615 from Graves Mill. The South River (located on private property) is one of the best trout waterways in the County and is located north of Stanardsville following both South River Road, Rt. 637 and Turkey Ridge, Rt. 638.

Greene County Parks & Recreation



Rapidan Wildlife Preserve

The Rapidan Wildlife Management Area is a popular place for wildlife and fish-related activities. While hunting, fishing and wildlife viewing are the primary uses of the area, hiking, camping and nature photography are also quite popular. Shenandoah National Park

Greene County is the gateway to the Shenandoah National Park and Skyline Drive, which crosses a beautiful section of the Blue Ridge Mountains. The Shenandoah National Park is accessible by Rt. 33 as well as by Skyline Drive. The Park offers many opportunities for camping, hiking, cycling, biking, fishing, bird watching, foraging and casual strolls. The Shenandoah River flows through the valley to the west, with Massanutten Mountain, 40 miles long, standing between the river's north and south forks. Rolling Piedmont country lies to the east of the park. The park holds more than 500 miles of trails, including 101 miles of the Appalachian Trail. Trails may follow a ridge crest, lead to high places with panoramic views, or pass through waterfalls in deep canyons. www.nps.gov/shen.
